

The Year of COVID-19

In June 2020, we found ourselves 3 months into the COVID-19 pandemic that had shut PCC's building doors on Sunday on March 15.

All campus activities were closed including the Preschool, SACC, and the Community Center. It became essential to protect those vulnerable to COVID-19 and the health system that would need to care for them. Within weeks, the local hospitals were full and loved ones were prohibited from visiting those afflicted.

PCC created alternative ways to continue being part of the household of God *and* to re-imagine what "church" is and how we were to connect as a community.

- + Online worship was made accessible by household
- + Small groups began to meet online
- + Community Center pivoted to offer online classes
- + Preschool offered online "reading time" to preschoolers
- + House Churches were formed to worship by neighborhood
- Ministry leaders touched base with congregation through emails and phone calls
- + Children's Ministry created online story time
- + Children's Ministry created at-home resources for kids and family
- + Student Ministry created weekly Zoom and socially-distant connections for students
- + Worship returned as Live on the Lawn Sunday, March 28, 2021
- + Our first indoor worship gathering back was Sunday, May 23, 2021



Peninsula Community Center

The PCC Community Center pivoted to meet the ever-changing San Mateo County Health Department and fitness industry requirements.

COVID restrictions demanded a shutdown. Reopening involved launching online and new outdoor classes, which became very popular!

PE+ Ministries, in partnership with Sequoia Healthcare District Foundation and the Redwood City School District, pivoted from an onsite program at 8 school sites to an online program—delivering to over 4,000 homes, serving kindergarten through 5th grade students.

School Age Child Care

San Mateo County approached SACC to provide childcare for essential workers, as they struggled to find needed support, and provided a grant of \$64,000 for this needed service.

SACC remained open throughout the 2020/2021 year by adapting both our summer program and school-year program to best serve families. For Swim & Gym, daily health checks were required for sign in, hourly sanitation protocol, and documentation of all cleaning procedures. 10 "pods" were created for 113 campers.

Distance-learning support was added to our afterschool program, 4 classes of 10 students each. We had 80 campers enrolled for After School Camp.



Preschool

The Preschool was closed on March 13, 2020. Within a week we pivoted to:

- + daily 20-minute Pre-K (4's and young 5's) Circle Time on Zoom
- + twice weekly for Preschool (3's), along with daily downloadable activities

They closed the year at the end of May with a drive-through PCC parking lot goodbye. Facemasked staff made posters and brought balloons, as families drove through the parking lot to wave and receive an end-of-year gift.

For the 2020-2021 school year, State and County guidelines required the Preschool to enroll no more than 12 children in a cohort.

God kept all the children and staff safe. The Preschool was open everyday and had no COVID exposure that required closing down!

Letter from PCC Leadership

Dear PCC Family,

It is with great thankfulness to God that we present the PCC Annual Report for the 2020-21 fiscal year. We are committed to serving you with this financial information. Thank you for your incredible support and generosity to PCC. Thanks to you, our overall financial situation is strong.

During the year, we had total income through donations and revenue of \$8.1 million (this includes both designated and undesignated giving). Our expenses totaled \$7.9 million, for a total net income of \$285,604. This includes the \$937,966 gain recognized on the forgiveness of the PPP loan, for which we are grateful, acknowledging its significant impact on our overall outcome in such a challenging year.

Church: Total income was **under** budget by \$167,802, but total expenses were also **under** budget by \$643,821, resulting in a *net cumulative positive budget impact of \$476,019*.

School Age Child Care: Total income was **under** budget by \$205,735, due to stops and starts, mandated closures, and capacity limitations due to COVID-19. Total SACC expenses were **over** budget by \$57,788, because of the need to maintain required staffing levels and for additional cleaning and sanitizing protocols. Thus instead of ending the year at a \$116,635 net income (as SACC had budgeted), they came in *\$263,523 below that*, ending with a net loss of \$146,888.

Preschool: Total income was **under** budget by \$127,234, due to COVID-19's impact, but Preschool was able to hold total expenses **under** budget by \$114,724 to offset the drop in tuition revenue. This allowed Preschool to end the year just *moderately over budget* by \$12,510.

Center: Total income was significantly **under** budget by \$1,094,862, due to COVID-19's impact, but total expenses were held **under** budget by \$858,122 to offset some of the loss of revenue. The Center budgeted for a net loss of \$577,337, but ended the year with a loss of \$814,077, which was a \$236,740 net negative budget impact.

Note: Budgeted amounts above do not include giving and expenses in designated funds, which are separate from budgeted giving.

The length of the COVID-19 shutdowns and restrictions affected all of our ministries. And yet, we are stronger financially than we could have ever imagined, in part due to the PPP loan forgiveness. We give thanks to God, who is faithfully shepherding PCC through this. And we give thanks to you for your faithfulness to PCC. We are committed to stewarding these resources wisely.
