Reflect on these three key aspects of Justice and the corresponding passages. How do they help or hinder your thoughts on the importance of seeking justice? And what is the role of love in seeking justice?

- God is just & loves justice (<u>Deuteronomy 32:4</u>) (<u>Psalm 33:5</u>)
- Jesus lived & died for the Justice of us all (<u>Luke 4:18</u>)
- The Spirit leads us in our call to Justice (Micah 6:8) (James 1:27)



If to *Seek Justice* is to **"make right what is not right"** in the eyes of God, what do you see around you (locally, nationally, globally) that stirs a "Holy Anger" in you that you want to do something about?



What small or large steps could you take to begin to *Seek Justice* based on your Holy Anger? And who could help or might you partner with?
