CONNECTION QUESTIONS

1. Who has made a significant difference in your life? What did they do that impacted you so profoundly?
2. Think of a time when you were able to help someone in a small but meaningful way. How did that feel?

READ MARK 5:1-20

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION QUESTIONS

3. When you hear the story of the man in Mark 5, what stands out to you most about how Jesus interacts with him?
4. The people of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave after He healed the man. Why do you think they valued their pigs more than learning more about Jesus? How does this compare to cultural values today?
5. Jesus told the healed man to “go home and tell your story.” Why do you think Jesus sent him back to his own people instead of letting him join the disciples?

APPLICATION QUESTIONS

6. The sermon emphasized that God doesn't call the equipped but equips the called. Have you ever felt unqualified to share your faith? How did Mark's message encourage you to overcome that feeling?
7. The people in the Gerasenes didn't initially want Jesus, but through the man's testimony, they were open later. How does this encourage you to share your faith, even if people aren't initially receptive?

PERSONAL REFLECTION QUESTIONS

8. The sermon highlighted that everyone has a story to share. What part of your story do you think could resonate with others?
9. What "other side" in your life might Jesus be calling you to cross? Is there a group of people, a relationship, or a situation where you feel prompted to step out in faith?

PRACTICAL CHALLENGE

10. Have you identified the people in your relational circle who need to hear about Christ? Who in your relational circle might need to hear about the difference Jesus has made in your life? What steps can you take to connect with them this week?
