Scripture: Acts 1:10–11

1. What stands out to you about the way Jesus is described as returning in Acts 1? How does it challenge or confirm the way you've previously imagined His second coming?
2. The sermon described the return of Jesus as an arrival, not an escape. How does that shape your view of what it means to live faithfully now?

TO JUDGE THE LIVING AND THE DEAD

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 5:10

3. How do you feel about the idea of standing before Christ to be judged—not just condemned, but to see everything set right?
4. In what ways does trusting in God's final judgment free you from the need to take matters into your own hands (vengeance, proving yourself, etc.)?

Scripture: Daniel 7:13–14

5. The sermon explored the idea that “Christians are people who have all the time in the world.” What pressure does that relieve in your life? Where do you still feel hurried or anxious?
6. What would change in your priorities or habits if you truly lived each day with eternity in mind?

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 15:42–44

7. How does believing in a future resurrection (of a real, physical body) change the way you think about death, healing, or aging?
8. Who are you most looking forward to seeing again in the resurrection? How does that hope comfort or shape you now?

Scripture: Revelation 21:1–5

9. Which part of the “new creation” described in Revelation 21 most resonates with you? Why?
10. If you truly believed the best is yet to come, how would that affect the way you love, serve, give, and grieve today?
