1.	Read Nehemiah 9:6–15. How do these verses serve as a reminder of who God is and what He's done for His people? What phrases or truths stand out to you personally?
2.	Pastor Mark talked about the danger of writing our own story instead of living into God's. Where in your life have you been tempted to write your own story? How does remembering God's faithfulness help us come back to His?
3.	Nehemiah 9 speaks about God's faithfulness even when His people were unfaithful. What does this reveal about God's character? How have you experienced this in your own journey?
4.	Read Nehemiah 10:29–39. What stands out to you about the people's commitment? Why do you think they were so specific in the promises they made?

5.	Pastor Mark identified three key areas of recommitment: spiritual integrity, Sabbath rhythms, and first fruits generosity. Which of these speaks most directly to you right now? Why?
6.	The people said, "We will not neglect the house of our God." What does that look like for us today? How can we live out that commitment practically?
7.	Read Nehemiah 11:1–2. What made it such a big deal for people to move into Jerusalem? Why do you think their willingness was publicly commended?
8.	Pastor Mark said it's one thing to say "I'm in," and another to actually step in and serve. Where do you sense God calling you to serve more sacrificially or courageously?
9.	Reflect on this past Sunday's commissioning moment. How did that time impact you? Who in your life do you want to commend or thank for stepping up in service?
10.	As we move into a new season as a church, what would it look like for you — personally and communally — to respond in joyful worship? How can this group support you in that?
