Psalm 78:1–7

BIG IDEA

The story must not end with us.

OPENING

Who told you about God's faithfulness when you were young?
Maybe a parent, grandparent, or teacher?

DIGGING IN

- Read Psalm 78:1–7. Verse 4 says, "we will not hide them from their children." Why does spiritual legacy have to be intentional rather than assumed?
- Verses 6–7 describe the purpose: so the next generation would "put their trust in God." What's the connection between remembering God's faithfulness and trusting Him for the future?
- Think of someone whose faith began at PCC as a child and still continues today. What made that possible?
- Who is in your life right now, a child, grandchild, or younger believer, that God may be calling you to intentionally disciple?
- What's one story of God's faithfulness in your life that you've never told someone younger than you?

LIVING IT OUT

This week, tell one story of God's faithfulness to someone younger in faith or age than you.

MEMORY VERSE

"We will not hide them from their descendants; we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord."

— Psalm 78:4

CLOSING PRAYER

Ask God for the courage and intentionality to pass on your faith to the next generation.
